NEON TWILIGHT

Based on the project of neon sign research, observe and analyse the visual beauty of neon signboards, and then bring out the patterns of various regions through the type of signboards, and explore how neon lights enrich our street space story and continue our collective memories and pairs. Hong Kong's sense of belonging, when the neon signs disappeared, left some good memories. The people I plan to interview, they are legend, for example, Liu Wen ---- is one of the last batches of neon sign makers in Hong Kong, engaged in half-century neon work. They witnessed the development of neon lights and places. I hope that through their reply and my integrated information, let the people understand how neon sign as a visual testimony to the social annual ring. I also hope that this project will give people who love street culture more perspectives, thinking and reading the possibilities of Hong Kong, make the people conscious of the function, use and local meaning. As I said before, in the late 1980s, neon light is one of the main soul in music/movie history. Through these mv/movies, I also want to bring more colour and images to the audience.







ITEM NAME : Hanger

Much of the plastic we use ends up in landfill. This is either because it is currently not possible to recycle . Since the vast majority of plastic is non-biodegradable, recycling is a part of global efforts to reduce plastic in the waste stream .

Thermosetting plastics cannot be recycled by the normal method of heating because the molecular bonds that bind them together burn instead of melting. There are cutting-edge LOCATION: St James' Park chemical processes that can be used, but they are a long way off being economically viable.

HOW LIFE CHANGE

When we trash food, plastic, paper and everything else, it must go somewhere, right? But often that somewhere is a place we we choose not to think about. The true story is that somewhere is actually everywhere: this is the story of how our our trash affects the whole planet.



Most of the products we consume in our daily life are made with petrochemical (fossil fuel-based) plastics, which leech chemicals into the environment though irresponsible disposal. In marine environments, the plastics actually absorb dangerous pollutants like PCBs, DDT and PAH from the surrounding waters, meaning animals that ingest the plastics get a double dose of chemical ingredients.

The chemicals in plastics are well-documented and studied to have proven negative impacts on animal and human bodies. From the Breast Cancer Fund, here is a list of just some of the chemicals found in plastic, such as: Bisphenol A and Phthalates ETC.

These chemicals are absorbed into any animal that ingests the plastic. These animals are then eaten by other, higher food chain animals or by humans. While many of the most dangerous chemicals have been phased out of use or production, they are still present in the marine environments, and thus present in the bodies of animals—including humans.


